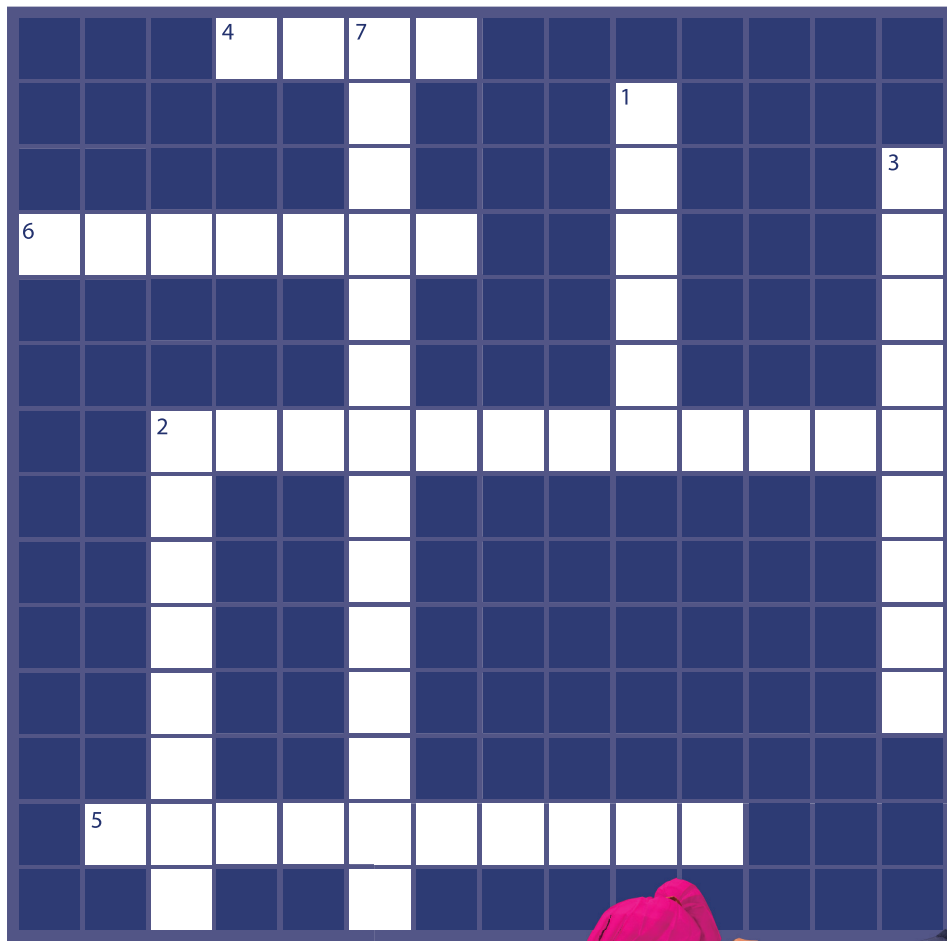

REFLECTIVE GEAR

1. Anytime you ride a bike or scooter, you should wear one of these.

Color all stop signs on the map red.



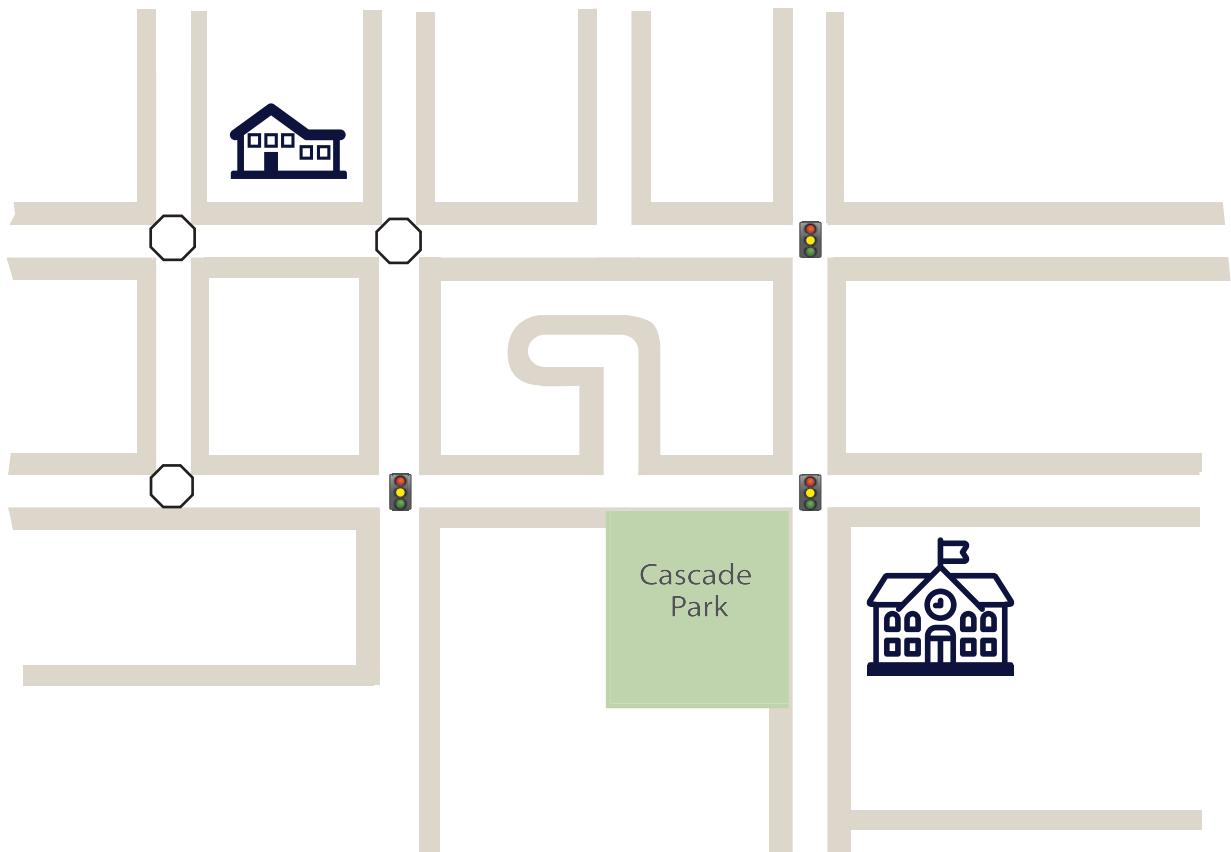
Fourth:
